The nonprofit strategies and operations minor will help students in any major prepare for careers in the nonprofit sector, including at NGOs, government agencies, foundations, and private development initiatives. The program emphasizes skills and knowledge in understanding, facilitating, organizing, and conducting the work of a nonprofit organization. This minor is designed to create opportunities for students to foster social change through their work for a nonprofit organization.

Outside of the classroom, our department works to provide all students with opportunities to enhance their St. Kate's experience and increase the value they bring to organizations after graduation. Therefore, internships at nonprofit organizations are a common complement to this minor. Students are encouraged to do internships throughout their coursework while enrolled in this program.
