

LIBERAL STUDIES - AA

These major requirements, in conjunction with the 20 credits of LIFE Core (<https://catalog.stkate.edu/undergraduate/core-curriculum/liberal-arts-science-core-curriculum-associate-programs/>), will help students towards completing the 60 credits required to earn an AA degree. Students may need additional coursework to reach the 60 credit threshold.
